**Activities at Come To Tolmers (CTT): Parents Information Sheet**

CTT activities are aimed at Scouts/Explorer Scouts or Guides/Ranger Guides up to 18 years of age and are capable of being completed by them regardless of previous experience or physical ability. The activities can also accommodate children with special needs who fall within the Scout/Explorer/Guide/Ranger age ranges.

All CTT activities adhere to Scout Association rules and are run by appropriately qualified instructors. A brief explanation of the CTT activities is given below. **10 Pin Bowling**

Takes place at a local bowling alley.

**Air Rifle Shooting and Laser Clay Shooting**

Run by National Small-Bore Rifle Association qualified instructors on an enclosed range using .177 rifles and competition-style targets. Laser clay shooters use a dummy gun which emits a harmless laser beam.

**Archery**

Run by Grand National Archery Society qualified instructors on an enclosed range.

**Climbing**

Supervised by competent instructors and done on artificial rock faces and climbing walls equipped with the required safety gear.

**CTT FM**

Activities related to our on-site radio and music station.

**Face painting/ balloon modelling**

Run by a dedicated children's face painting contractor.

**Fire & Cooking**

Preparation and cooking of food on open fires. Supervised by adult leaders.

**Journalism**

Activities related to collecting stories and publishing them in the on-site daily newspaper.

**Inflatables**

These include Bouncy Castles, Gladiators, Inflatable Assault Course and It's a Knockout. Adult leaders supervise all Inflatables.

**Off-site activities**

Where activities take place away from Tolmers, a schools coach company transports participants to and from the activity base.

**Quad Biking**

Two dedicated courses for children over and under 12 years of age, supervised by specialist contractors.

**Splash Pool**

12-foot diameter, 3 foot deep paddling pool supervised by adult leaders.

**Swimming**

Takes place at a local authority pool staffed by their own qualified lifeguards.

**Theatrical Activities**

Participants rehearse and perform in front of the other campers at a campfire or flag down.

**Water Activities**

The Scout association rules state that members taking part in any water activity should be able swim 50 metres in ordinary clothes and keep afloat for five minutes.

**Sailing**

Takes place offsite on class B1 waters. All instructors will hold the necessary qualification where required.

**Canoeing**

Takes place on a small inland lake on site which is unclassified water. Buoyancy aids are worn at all times and instructors hold the necessary qualifications. Any non swimmers can take part in this if parental permission allows but should make themselves know to the Instructors at the beginning of the session.

**Raft Building**

Takes place on a small inland lake on site which is classed as unclassified water. Buoyancy aids are worn at all times.

**Rope-a-Phobia**

A mobile high ropes course run by trained instructors. It offers participants the opportunity to take part in a number of exciting and challenging activities approximately 22ft. from the ground. With 8 elements in total this attraction provides a series of challenges to test players' skill and their nerves – all at the same time!

**Bungee Trampoline**

An opportunity to do jumps and somersaults high into the air, always supported by bungee cords. Run by trained instructors.
